

Rio Tinto Dinner Meeting

Chamber members gathered at the Chalet Restaurant October 27 for an opportunity to network over dinner and meet Rio Tinto General Manager Gareth Manderson. Having settled in Kitimat with his family in early September 2016, Gareth has had time to appreciate the history of Kitimat Works and reflect on the future of the modernized smelter.

Attendees viewed a slide show of some 125 plus photos "Building the vision.... 1950 - The Kitimat Project" and "Building a vision Kitimat 2.0 – A modernised smelter". With time for Q & A we learned that the smelter is at full production and utilizing increased electricity but still able to meet its commitments to BC Hydro. Work continues at Kemano in maintaining and ensuring uninterrupted supply of power to the modernised smelter.



Minette Bay West Concept Plan - Community Survey


